The Energy Transition Act for Green Growth

Territories - Citizens - Companies



-40% of greenhouse gas emissions in 2030 compared to 1990



-**30%** of fossil fuel consumption in 2030 compared to 2012 raise the share of renewable energy in final energy consumption to **32%** and to **40%** of electricity production



reduce final energy consumption by **50% by 2050** compared to 2012



-**50%** of waste in landfills by 2025

diversify electricity production and reduce the share of nuclear energy to **50%** by 2035

- Per capita GHG emissions among the lowest in the EU and the G20
- or -16% between 1990 and 2016 with +15% of the population and +49% of GDP








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The climate solidarity package

Poverty 14% of the population (60% of median standard of living) Energy Precarity 11.6 (spend more than 8% of their resources on energy



(spend more than 8% of their resources on energy) 4.9% of families have problems maintaining an adequate temperature in their home

Measures provided for in the Energy Transition and Green Growth Act:

- Energy Check
- Energy Transition Tax Credit Energy Savings Certificates



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The Energy Check



Why?

Rationalise the social tariff system

What is it for?

Pay bills (gas, electricity)Paying for works to improve energy efficiency



Who are the beneficiaries? 5.8 million families in 2019 Households with less than

- 10700€ income (single person)
- 16050€ (couple without child)
- 19260€ (couple with 1 child)
- +3210€ per additional person

How much is the subsidy?

Between 48€ and 227€ depending on the size of the family and resources



The tax credit for energy transition



Who are the beneficiaries?

Tenants, landlords or occupants of a dwelling free of charge.

What's it for?

To carry out energy saving works.



What if the family doesn't pay taxes?

If you don't pay tax or if the tax credit exceeds the tax, the state return the money.

How much is the tax credit?

- Between 15% (windows) and 30% of the value of the equipment.
- 50 % of the cost of labour for the change of a fuel system (with resource conditions).

Limit of expenses of $8000 \in$ for a person and $16\ 000 \in$ for a wanker (plus $400 \in$ for each person in charge).



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From 2020 onwards, transformation into direct aid to low-income families and faster payment



Example of the CTE Sambre-Avesnois

The Territory:

232 000 inhabitants Deindustrialization, agricultural crisis

- 15% unemployment
- Income below 15% regional average
- 25% poverty

Objetives:

- Resorption of territorial fractures with strengthened ecological cohesion.
- Support for sustainable development through a 3rd industrial revolution.
- Energy management and preservation of natural spaces.
- Valuing environmental advantages in order to promote the territory and build the future.
