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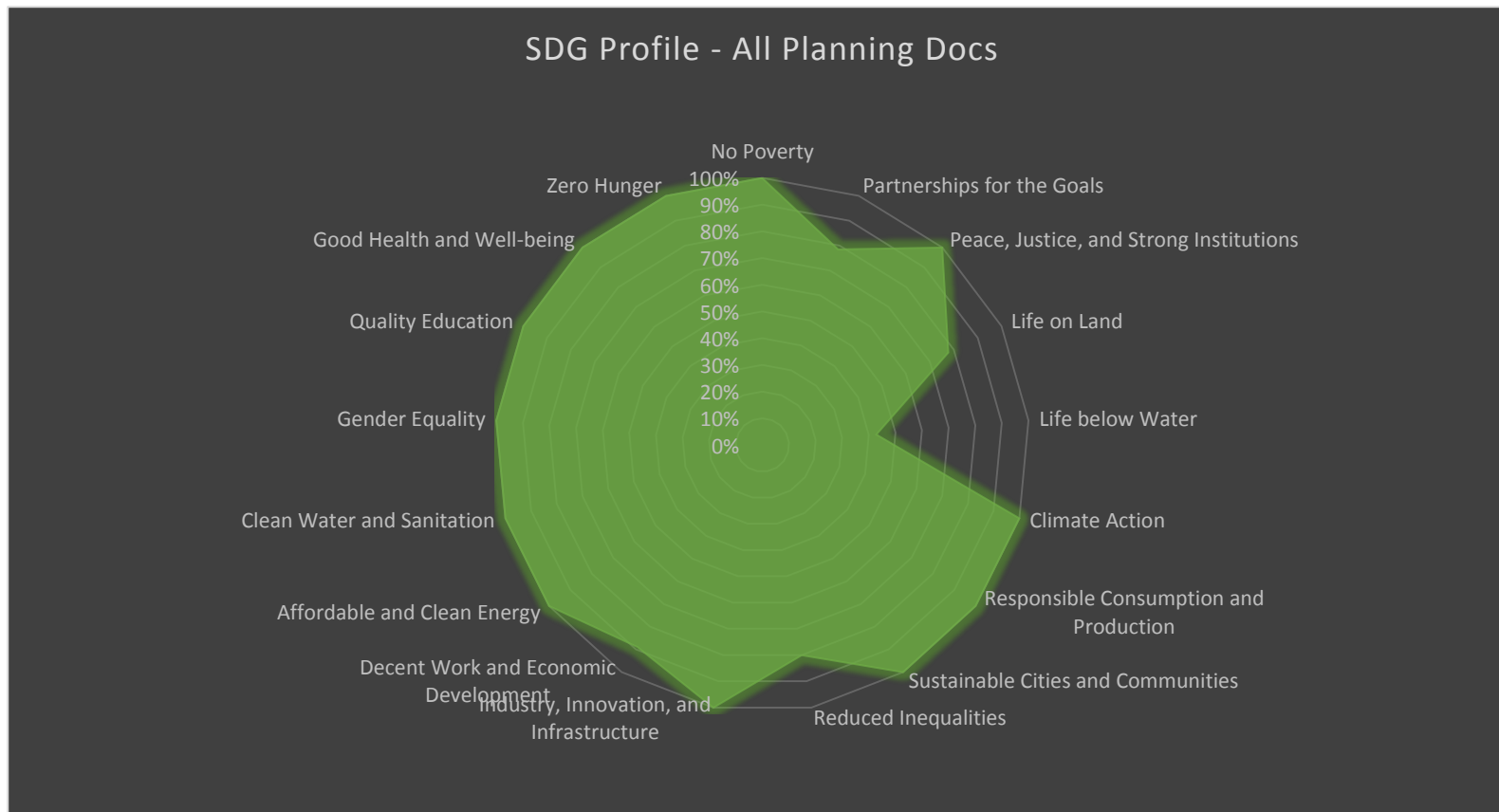

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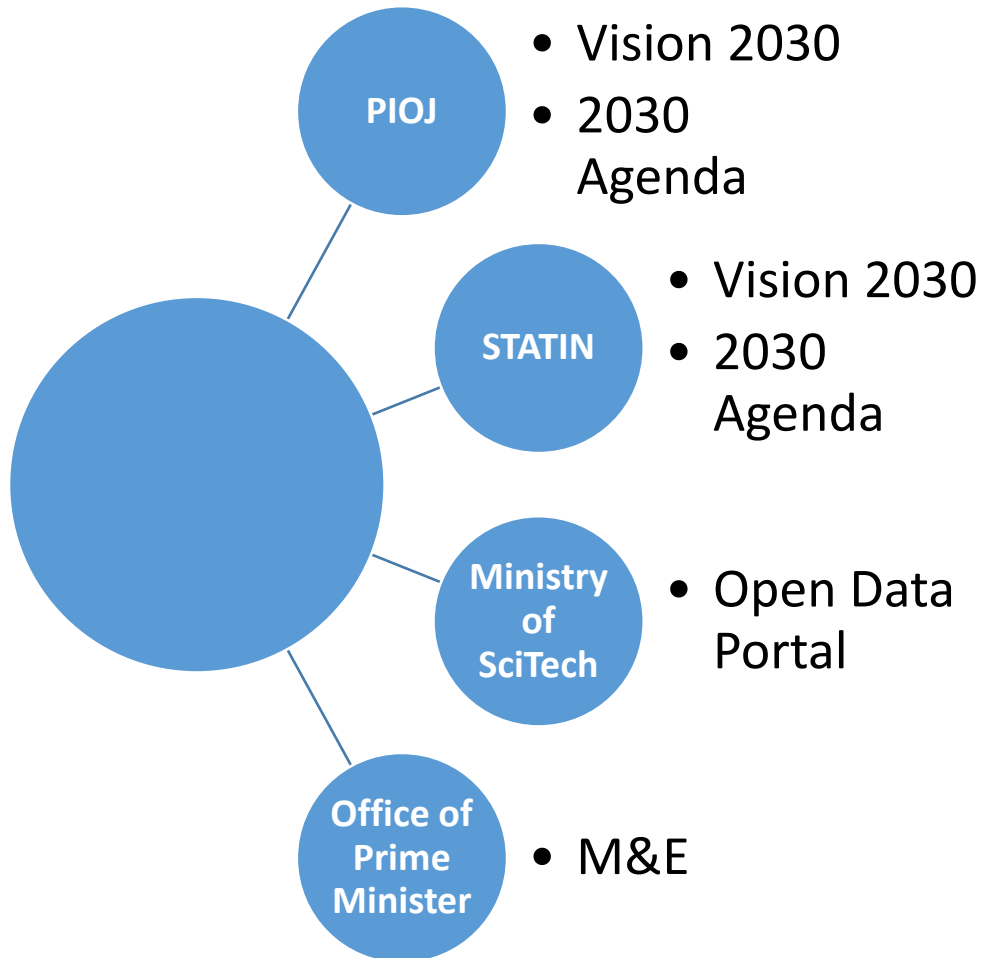
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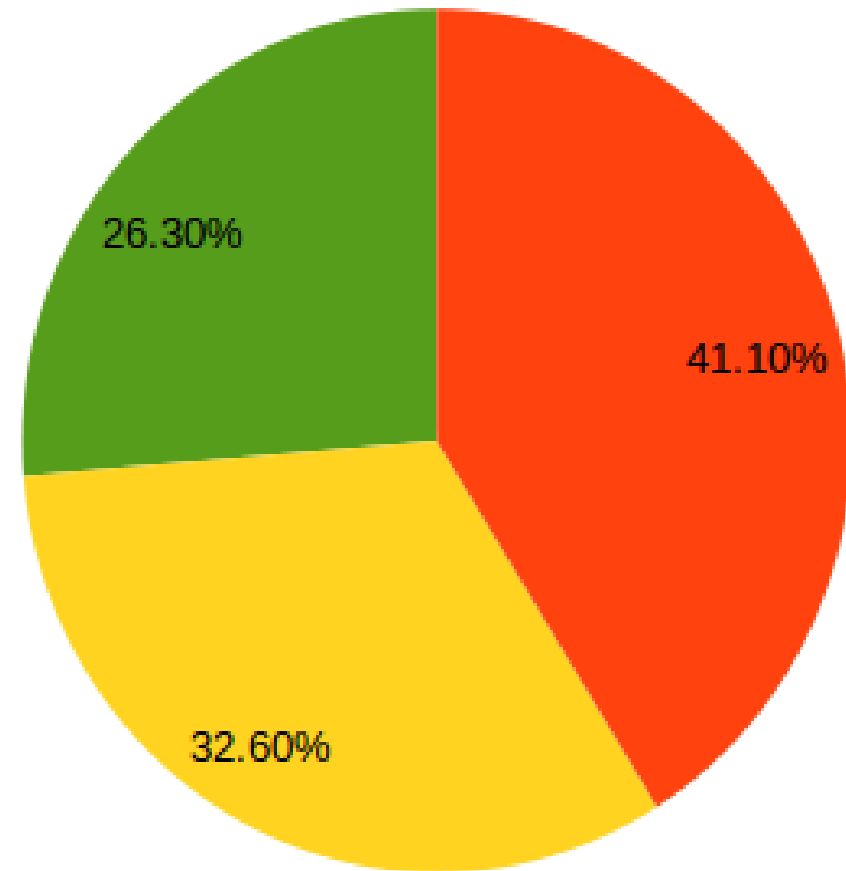

**1994:** Barbados/SIDS Programme of Action for Small Island Developing States (BPOA)

**2010:** High Level Plenary Meeting of the UNGA reviews progress on the MDG and agrees on concrete action plan to accelerate progress

**2014:** Samoa (SIDS Accelerated Modalities of Action) Pathway: Third International Conference on Small Island Developing States (SIDS), Samoa

**2004:** Mauritius Strategy for the further Implementation of the BPOA (MSI)

**2012:** Rio + 20 conference recommends Third International Conference on Small Island Developing States (SIDS), Samoa
