ACHIEVMENTS:

SOCIAL SERVICES

Home care :

Home Help Care - trained persons visit and care for the elderly at home.

There are approximately 544 elderly who are currently receiving support under Home help care.

Institutional care

One Government fully funded home with a capacity of 56 persons.

Two Privately run homes but receive subvention from Government

Four Faith-based (Catholic) homes also supported financially by Government

There are approximately 58 elderly persons combined at the private and faith-based homes

Financial Assistance –

A monthly allowance of EC\$250.00 is provided to elderly under the Public Assistance programme

Daycare Services

day care services are also available (north and south-west)

- such services are run by the HELPAGE- National Council of and For Older persons

HELPAGE - National Council of and For Older Persons

- facilitate and support social groups and activities
- advocate on behalf of the elderly
- Preferential access at banks and other financial centers



SOCIAL SERVICES

Centenarian Recognition Programme

Celebration and recognition of centenarians

* Yearly celebration of International Day for the Elderly - October 30

Recognition of contributions of elderly



HEALTH CARE

Provision of Free medication for older persons with diabetes and hypertension

Regular home visits by Community Health Aids visits to conduct medical examination eg: d blood pressure and glucose test

Training of programs for persons working in institutions which provide care for older persons

CHALLENGES/GAPS



National Policy in draft

Lack of a dedicated unit/staff to respond to issues of abuse of the Elderly

Absence of National Policy on Standards of care in institutions

PRIORITIES / PLANS

Ratification of a National Policy on Ageing

Restructuring of the department of Human Services as well as the Social safety net reform that will see the merging of cash and non cash support to vulnerable groups which includes the elderly. This will result in creation of a special unit to respond issues of the elderly especially reports of Elder abuse.
