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# The VNR process: Building-up momentum

## Why communicate the VNR process?

• To **raise public awareness** on the 2030 Agenda and the SDGs, inform and involve a wider range of stakeholders (urban vs. rural, indigenous groups, youth...) in the VNR process and the overall implementation of the 2030 Agenda

- To invite **target audiences** to follow the VNR presentation during the HLPF
- To promote transparency regarding the VNR preparation process and build trust with stakeholders
- To **share key results** of the VNR during and after the HLPF
- To strengthen partnerships with existing stakeholders or raise interest of potential partners
- Life after VNR: follow-up to the 2030 Agenda implementation strategy

# **Examples of good practices on VNR dissemination**

- Press and social media campaigns:
- Institutional accounts in social media to highlight VNR progress: (Dominican Republic, 2018);
- Consistent slogan ahead, during & after the VNR presentation (#Uruguaysumavalor in 2018);
- Use of # and @ with delegation members or participating institutions in the VNR process (Cuba 2021)
- Messages during & after the HLPF with links to presentation and live transmission (Panamá y Perú 2020)
- Translate VNR to other national languages to reach a wider audience (Mexico 2018)
- VNR components showcased on the UN DESA SDG Acceleration Actions Platform (Peru 2019)
- National presentation of the VNR prior to the HLPF (Argentina 2020 and 2022)
- National thematic workshops on the three dimensions of sustainable development (Chile 2019)
- Contest to design the cover of the VNR with universities (Mexico 2021
- Development of a website post-HLPF for disseminating the VNR and stakeholder engagement (Antigua and Barbuda 2021)

### The VNR process: Presentation at the HLPF

- **Timing**: <u>First timers</u>: 30 mins at the HLPF: 10 minutes for presentation and 20 minutes for Q&A; <u>Second, third and fourth timers</u>: 25 mins at the HLPF: 10 minutes for presentation and 15 minutes for Q&A.
- Best practices: Present at the highest level; highlight SDG situation, trends, achievements, challenges, areas for support and advice, next steps; focus whole presentation on the 2030
   Agenda (avoid descriptions of country's history and geography) including in videos; respond to questions (even after the HLPF); adapt to international audience and be brief; consider involving multiple stakeholders in delegations.

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### **General Information on the 2022 HLPF**

- <u>DATES</u>: The meeting of the HLPF in 2022 will be held from **Tuesday, 5 July, to Thursday, 7 July, and from Monday, 11 July, to Friday, 15 July 2022**, under the auspices of the Economic and Social Council. This includes the **three-day ministerial segment of the forum from Wednesday, 13 July, to Friday, 15 July 2022**. The **high-level segment of the Council** will conclude with a final day on **Monday, 18 July 2022**.
- <u>THEME</u>: The theme for the 2022 HLPF is "**Building back better from the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) while advancing the full implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development**.
- <u>SDGs UNDER REVIEW</u>: The HLPF will also review in-depth Sustainable Development Goals 4 on quality education, 5 on gender equality, 14 on life below water, 15 on life on land, and 17 on partnerships for the Goals. It will consider the different impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic across all SDGs.
- <u>VNRs</u>: 44 countries will carry out VNRs, 7 from the region of Latin America and the Caribbean.
- <u>OUTCOMES</u>: The HLPF will adopt the **Ministerial Declaration** as the outcome of its session. The President of ECOSOC will prepare a summary to capture the key messages of the discussions.
