

Competition policy towards the COVID-19 crisis and the reactivation Wednesday August 5, 2020

The COVID-19 pandemic is having a profound impact on the economy and society in Latin America and the Caribbean.

ECLAC estimates that before the end of 2020, 2.7 million companies could close, equivalent to 19% of all formal firms in the region. The crisis affects all companies, particularly MSMEs, which, due to their weight in the business structure of the region, becomes more relevant. This can translate into the closure of numerous companies and the loss of a large number of jobs.

One expected effect is an increase in the concentration of the economy, which will require concerted action between authorities in charge of ensuring free competition and those in charge of implementing measures aimed at sustaining the productive structure and avoiding the destruction of MSMEs capacities. Dialogue and concerted action by both entities will be crucial in the period of economic recovery.

ECLAC in conjunction with UNCTAD proposes a dialogue to analyze economic scenarios that affect companies and sectors in Latin America, identify possible actions and competition policies and look how it could contribute to the business sector recovery, particularly the MSME sector.
