GLORIA ABRAHAM. International consultant. She was Ambassador of Costa Rica to the WTO and served as chair of the WTO negotiations on agriculture. She was previously IICA Representative in Mexico and was also the first woman to be appointed Minister of Agriculture and Livestock in Costa Rica. She has extensive experience in international and regional organizations; she has held various positions at IICA, UNDP, CATIE, the WB and ICAP. She has been a professor at the University of Costa Rica and the National University of Costa Rica and has a long list of technical publications.



MARIA NOEL ACKERMANN. Economist from the School of Economics and Administration of the Universidad de la República (UDELAR). Specialization in Animal Production and Agribusiness at the Faculty of Agronomy-UDELAR, with her thesis still pending completion. She works as a technician at the Office of Agricultural Programming and Policy (OPYPA) of the Ministry of Livestock, Agriculture and Fisheries (MGAP) with emphasis on the analysis of agro-industrial chains and studies related to the support structure provided to the agricultural sector and the analysis of the agricultural labor market.
