Programming of Global Europe

- → Initial long-term planning 2021-2027 to define priority areas, specific objectives, results, indicators and indicative allocations per country and region.
- → Process completed by the end of 2021 with the adoption of Multi-annual Indicative Programmes by a College's decision.
- → Iterations EU Delegations/HQ, consultations with Government, EU MS and their agencies and financial institutions, CSOs incl. Women and Youth, Local authorities, private sector, UN/IFIs, EIB/EBRD, other key stakeholders
- →MIPs also contain indicative financial allocations as well as results and indicators (with baseline and targets) to measure EU intervention effectiveness
- → Each year, the European Commission will adopt Annual Action Plans setting out the implementation of these programmes.

2.6B without access to clean fuels for cooking (34% of the world's population)

Far from achieving SDG7...

INSTRUMENTS in our "tool box"



POLICY DIALOGUE: advocate for holistic energy sector policy reforms, increase awareness on the benefits of a energy transition (sustainable, fair and affordable), green public financial management (green procurement, reduction of environmentally harmful subsidies, sustainable finance), facilitate dialogue with civil society and the private sector;

Examples: EUDs work, INTPA, other line DGS, EUROCLIMA+, etc

TECHNICAL ASSISSTANCE AND CAPACITY BUILDING: Support to regulatory, policy and governance reforms, enhancing public planning and implementation capacities, transfer suitable experience from the EU energy transition to partner countries

Examples: GTAF (RH2), EUROCLIMA+, Get.Transform, GCCA+, DG-ENER, JRC, etc.

SUPPORT TO PRIVATE SECTOR INVESTMENTS: mobilize and de-risk private and public green energy investments in cooperation with Development Finance Institutions (DFIs) through blending including guarantees, budget support subject to advancement of sector reform efforts

Examples: Get.Invest, Financial Instruments (ElectriFI, CIO, DEF,), Blending (LAIF, CIF, etc.), etc.




