

Background

- The informal sector represents a fundamental component of the economic structure of many developing countries;
- Is a key form of the organization of production, provider of employment and income opportunities in both rural and urban areas;
- It accounts for over 50% of non-agricultural employment and nearly 30% of non-agricultural GDP in many developing countries;





Objectives

- The Project aims to: improve data on informal sector and on informal employment to promote evidence-based social policies;
- improve national capacity to produce more comprehensive data on GDP and employment (especially for women);
- contribute towards monitoring a range of MDGs and Targets (e.g. Eradicate extreme poverty and hunger and Promote gender equality and empower women);





Objectives (Cont'd)

- Improve existing MDG indicators related to poverty and women's economic participation;
- Facilitate the development of more adequate measures of gender equality and women's economic empowerment.





Outputs

- Advocacy: raise awareness and facilitate more regular funding for statistical activities related to the informal sector and informal employment; also, contribute to a durable, self-sustaining upgrade of the national statistical system:
- <u>Statistical capacity building:</u> improve capacity to collect data on the informal sector and informal employment, and to compile more comprehensive estimates of GDP:
- <u>Data collection:</u> To increase the number of countries that regularly collect statistics on the informal sector and informal employment, and integrate these estimates in the compilation of their National Accounts

Outputs (Cont'd)

- <u>Data analysis and dissemination:</u> To improve national technical capacity in the use and dissemination of statistics on the informal sector and informal employment;
- Knowledge management: To promote knowledge sharing in building national technical capacity - both within project countries and beyond:





Achievements

- Completion of a 1-2 survey of the informal sector in Saint Lucia; production of estimates on the size of the informal sector as well as its contribution to GDP
- 2. Provision of training to statisticians from 8 Caribbean Countries on the use of the 1-2 survey methodology for conducting a survey of the informal sector
- 3. Raising awareness through advocacy and other fora of the value of measuring informality in the region





Conclusion

- Urgent need for international focus on key challenges with the '1-2' methodology;
- Concerns expressed about the sampling reliability;
- Length and 'wordy-ness' of the questionnaire;
- Source of future funding
