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

Parliamentary participation in the VNR process

- Parliamentary participation in the VNR process is increasing
- Recognition in the oversight role is growing
- Parliaments are included in National SDG Councils, committees and Working Groups
- Participation in consultations, workshops, conferences and roundtables
- Review of VNR before HLPF submission
- However, substantial participation of Parliaments is lacking in many cases

Entry points to engage in the VNR process

Planning (including setting scope & structure) & institutionalizing

Gathering inputs, consultations, data

Writing & review

HLPF Presentation & follow up



Engagement ofthe Parliament in the VNRs/SDG implementati on efforts in Denmark

#### Denmark:

- The Danish Parliament wrote chapter of the 2021 VNR report
- Parliament integrated the SDGs into their core strategies
- 'Danish 2030 Network'/Panel 2030
- 2018: Parliamentary Working Group
- The VNR presents efforts to implement the SDGs by the Parliament

Parliamentary engagement in the Voluntary Local Reviews VLRs are an opportunity to create a local bottom up response that reflects the context of local communities

**National Parliaments:** 

- Limited focus on the role of Parliament in SDG localization/VLRs
- Parliament can approve the SDG localization efforts and help promote VLRs
- A first copy of the VLR can be shared with members of Parliament to discuss ways to address the gaps and challenges
- Present the VLR as a joint VNR/VLR launch

#### **Sub-national Parliaments:**

- Role should mirror the national process
- Endorsement of the VLR by local parliament
- Ensure complementing by the national SDG review efforts

What can Parliaments and MPs do to support the VNRs/VLRs?

- MPs can represent citizens and their constituencies in the VNRs and VLRs
- They can seek regular input from their constituents at local and national level e.g. through consultations
- Mainstreaming the SDGs into the work of the Parliament
- Create committee oversight (Using Existing committee or SDG Committee, or all committee work)
- Parliaments can help support multilevel governance and VLR activities by promoting these e.g. through organizing hearings
- National and local parliaments need to be encouraged to contribute to the 2030 Agenda by improving their knowledge and skills, strengthening technical support, developing (localized) indicators and monitoring progress
