
Background on the Arab region

- One of the lowest regions receiving AfT.
- One of the lowest regional trade rates.
- Low tariffs but high NTB.
- low productive capacities & High degree of similarities.
- Low PPP and FDI into trade related infrastructure.
- Customs union by 2015.


Transportation

- Lack of maritime and railways transport.
- 50% of the trip time spent at the boarder.
- Good international corridors.






ESCWA strategy 1

Implementing the DA project

- Five countries were selected.
- Lebanon, Jordan, Morocco, Tunisia and Yemen.
- Countries were invited to submit their initial project proposals.
- Few project titles/concept notes received from countries.





Missions to countries

- Two missions to some countries and briefing for others over the phone.
- To explain the aid for trade initiative and seek project proposals.
- Few projects were identified that fall within the scope of aid for trade.
- Discussed with officials main components of typical proposals.





Preparation stage

- Some guidance was provided to countries to develop their project proposals.
- Drafts received and reviewed by ESCWA staff.
- Comments were provided to countries and revision were requested.
- Revised drafts were received.
- Preparation for workshop started.





Workshop in Morocco, Oct 2013

 Assisting Arab countries to leverage diverse forms of development finance to promote trade and development through an "investment for trade" approach.
