# WORKING GROUP ON CAPACITY-BUILDING AND COOPERATION

- Objective of the WG according to the Plan of Action to 2014:
  - Formulate a proposal to intensify regional and international cooperation on the basis of the training and financing needs and options, both for the public sector and the public in general
- Action lines of the WG for 2014:
  - Discuss possible alternatives to integrate the activities of the Working Group with the development of a regional instrument
    - Study the operation and effectiveness of the cooperation mechanisms present in the different instruments of environmental or regional character



# OBJECTIVE OF ECLAC'S REVIEW OF MEAS

- Review capacity-building and cooperation models on the basis of the existing mechanisms in the texts of MEAs
- Inform WG discussions to prepare a proposal of content on capacity-building and cooperation to be considered in the regional instrument to fully implement access rights in environmental matters

  - Information / awareness-raising / education
- Capacity-building of authorities and civil servants

# CAPACITY-BUILDING AND COOPERATION IN AARHUS AND KIEV

### Aarhus Convention (1998)

- Mainstreamed (lack of specific article)
- Mainly under General Provisions (art. 3)
  - Assistance and guidance to the public by officials (art. 3.2)
  - ▶ Environmental education and awareness (art. 3.3)
  - ▶ Recognition and support of environmental organizations (art. 3.4)
  - Exchange of information (art. 10.2)
  - Promotion of the application of the principles of the Convention at the international level (art. 3.7)
  - ▶ COP may establish necessary financial arrangements (art. 10.3)



# CAPACITY-BUILDING AND COOPERATION IN AARHUS AND KIEV

### Kiev Protocol (2003)

- Capacity-building (art. 15)
  - Public awareness of PRTR and assistance and guidance to access information, understand it and make use of it
  - Parties should provide adequate capacity-building for and guidance to responsible authorities and bodies
- International cooperation (art. 16)
  - Support the objectives of the Protocol at the international level
  - Exchange of information
  - Mutual cooperation and cooperation with international organizations to promote public awareness at the international level, transfer of technology and technical assistance
- Meeting of the Parties (art. 17)
  - Shall consider establishing financial arrangements by consensus and technical assistance mechanisms to facilitate the implementation of the Protocol



### 1. Technical assistance and creation / building of capacities

- **Express recognition** of the importance and need of technical assistance to effectively implement the convention
  - Art. 14.1 Minamata and art. 12 Stockholm: timely and appropriate assistance
  - ▶ Art. 16 Rotterdam, art. 19 UNCCD, and art. 18 CBD
- Link between compliance of the convention and capacity-building and cooperation
  - ▶ Art. 13.2 Minatama, art. 22.2Cartagena and art. 5 Montreal
- Special consideration of the specific needs and circumstances of countries
  - Art. 14 Minamata, art. 12.2 and 12.5 Stockholm, art. 22.2 Cartagena, art. 3.2 UNFCCC and art. 10.4 Basel



- Definition of what is understood by capacity-building / establishment of priorities
  - Art. 19 UNCCD: understands by capacity-building institution building, training and development of relevant local and national capacities and lists capacity-building actions that States shall promote
  - ▶ Art. 18 CBD: development and implementation of national policies. Special attention should be given to development and strengthening of national capabilities, by means of human resources development and institution building
  - Art. 22 Nagoya: list of key areas and measures



### Framework / means to provide assistance

- Art. 7 Annex III (Latin America and the Caribbean) UNCCD: national focal points, coordination mechanism of the latter and periodic meetings of the Parties
- Regional, subregional and national level (art. 14 Minamata, art. 22 Nagoya)
- Regional and subregional capacity-building centres (art. 10.4 and 12.4 Stockholm and art. 14 Basel)
- Private sector and other relevant stakeholders (art. 22 Cartagena)
- Den mechanism: COP shall determine how to establish a clearing-house mechanism to promote and facilitate technical and scientific cooperation (art. 18.3 CBD)



### 2. Exchange of information

- Directly, through the Secretariat or in cooperation with other organizations
- Appointment of focal points
- Information on human health and safety and the environment shall not be regarded as confidential (art. 9.5 Stockholm, art. 17.5 Minamata)
- Art. 17 Minamata, art. 9 Stockholm, art. 4.1 (h) UNFCCC, art. 14 Rotterdam, art. 16 UNCCD, art. 20 Cartagena, art. 14 Nagoya, art. 4.1 and Annex II Vienna and art. 9 Montreal

### 3. Access / transfer of technology

 Art. 14 Minamata, art. 18 UNCCD, art. 23 Nagoya, 4.5 UNFCCC and art. 10 A Montreal



# CAPACITY-BUILDING AND COOPERATION BETWEEN THE INSTRUMENT AND STATE PARTIES

#### I. COP

- Make recommendations on capacity-building and transfer of technology (art. 14.5 Minamata and 12.3 and 12.4 Stockholm), promote and facilitate the exchange of information (art. 22.2b UNCCD) and scientific and technical cooperation (art. 18.3 CBD)
- Review requests for technical assistance (art. 1 1 Montreal)

#### 2. Technical Secretariat

- Facilitate the exchange of information (art. 17.3 and 24.2d Minamata, art. 9.2 Stockholm, art. 8.2b UNFCCC, art. 13.4c Kyoto, art. 7 Vienna)
- Facilitate assistance to Parties (art. 24.2b Minamata, art. 19 Rotterdam, art. 8.2c UNFCCC, art. 13.4d Kyoto) and receive and convey information from and to Parties on sources of technical assistance and training, available technical and scientific know-how, sources of advice and expertise and availability of resources (art. 16.1g Basel)

#### 3. Clearing-house or other multilateral cooperation mechanisms

Art. 9.4 Stockholm, art. 20 Cartagena, art. 10 Nagoya and art. 12 Kyoto



### CAPACITY BUILDING OF THE PUBLIC

- Provision of available information to the public
- Training and awareness-raising
- Environmental education
  - Art. 18 Minamata:
    - In collaboration with relevant intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations and vulnerable populations
    - Use existing mechanisms or give consideration to the development of new mechanisms (PRTR)
  - Art. 10 Stockholm:
    - Educational and public awareness programmes, especially for women,
       children and the least educated
    - Development and exchange of educational and public awareness materials at the national and international levels
    - Development and implementation of education and training programmes



### CAPACITY-BUILDING OF THE PUBLIC

#### Art. 19 UNCCD:

- Organization of awareness campaigns for the general public
- Access by the public to relevant information and wide public participation in education and awareness activities
- Encourage the establishment of associations that contribute to public awareness
- Develop and exchange educational and public awareness material, where possible in local languages
- Fully utilize relevant educational material available in competent international bodies

#### Art 13 CBD:

- Inclusion in educational programmes/ propagation through media
- Art. 6 UNFCCC:
  - Development and implementation of educational programmes
  - Development and exchange of educational and public awareness material on climate change and its effects
  - At the regional, national and international level



### CAPACITY-BUILDING OF THE PUBLIC

#### Art. 21 Nagoya:

- Promotion of this Protocol, including its objective
- Organization of meetings of indigenous and local communities and relevant stakeholders
- Establishment and maintenance of a help desk for indigenous and local communities and relevant stakeholders
- Information dissemination through a national clearing-house;
- Promotion of voluntary codes of conduct, guidelines and best practices and/or standards in consultation with indigenous and local communities and relevant stakeholders:
- Promotion of, as appropriate, domestic, regional and international exchanges of experience

#### Art. 9 Montreal

▶ Each Party shall submit to the Secretariat a summary of the activities it has conducted in this matter (every 2 years)



## CAPACITY-BUILDING OF AUTHORITIES AND CIVIL SERVANTS

#### Art. 10 Stockholm

- Awareness-raising among policy and decision-makers
- Training of workers, scientists, educators, and technical and managerial personnel

#### Art. 19 UNCCD

- Training of managers and decision-makers
- More effective operation of existing national institutions and legal frameworks

#### Art. 18 CBD

Cooperation in the training of personnel and exchange of experts

#### Art. 6 UNFCCC

- Training of scientific, technical and managerial personnel
- Strengthening of national institutions and exchange or secondment of personnel to train experts



# REGIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

- Between State Parties at the regional and international level
  - Coordination and cooperation between Parties (Art. 11 Stockholm, art. 15 Rotterdam, art. 3, 8 and 9 UNCCD, art. 5 and 18.1 CBD, art. 22 Cartagena, art. 10.4 Basel and art. 2 Vienna)
  - Cooperation in education and awareness-raising at the international level (art. 19.3 UNCCD, art. 13b CBD, art. 6 UNFCCC, art. 10 Kyoto)
- Between the instrument and other instruments
  - Art. 22.2 UNCCD and art. 7.2 UNFCCC



### FINANCING

#### Financial resources

- Each Party shall supply resources to **national activities** aimed at implementing the convention (art. 13.1 Minamata, art. 13.1 Stockholm, art. 20.1 CBD)
- National, multilateral and bilateral financing (art. 13.3 Minamata, art. 13.3 Stockholm, art. 4.2 UNCCD)

### Financial mechanisms

- Minamata, Stockholm, UNCCD, CBD, Nagoya, Cartagena, UNFCCC, Kyoto, Montreal
- References to capacity-building
  - Art. 13.4 Stockholm, art. 25.3 Nagoya, 28.3 Cartagena, art. 10.3 Montreal



### FINANCING

- Compliance dependent upon obtainment of financial resources
  - Art. 13.2 Minamata, art. 13.4 Stockholm, art. 20.7 UNCCD and art 20.4 CBD
- ▶ MINAMATA: Specific international programme to support capacity-building and technical assistance (art. 13.6 b) and 13.9)
  - Under the guidance of the COP
  - Hosting institution shall be an existing entity
  - All Parties and other relevant stakeholders are invited to provide financial resources on a voluntary basis
