



# The Performance Gap

The World Bank produces the Statistical Performance Index (SPI) whose framework focuses on five key pillars of a country's statistical performance:

- 1. Data use 'its of no value unless its used'
- 2. Data services what services are provided?
- 3. Data products what products are being produced?
- 4. Data sources where can we actually find the data?
- 5. Data infrastructure what infrastructure exist, even for accessibility and storage?



**Data literacy** is the ability to read, write, analyze, communicate, and reason with data. It's a skill that allows individuals and organizations to make better, data-driven decisions

- Lack of understanding
- Data overload what is reliable and what is spurious
- Difficulty in communicating data
- Poor quality data
- Insufficient tools and resources
- Low confidence in data skills
- Reluctance to adopt data-driven decision making.




