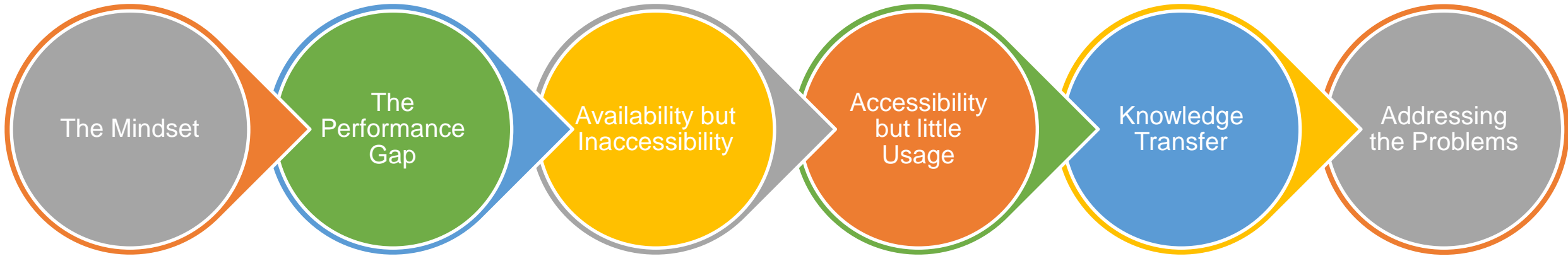

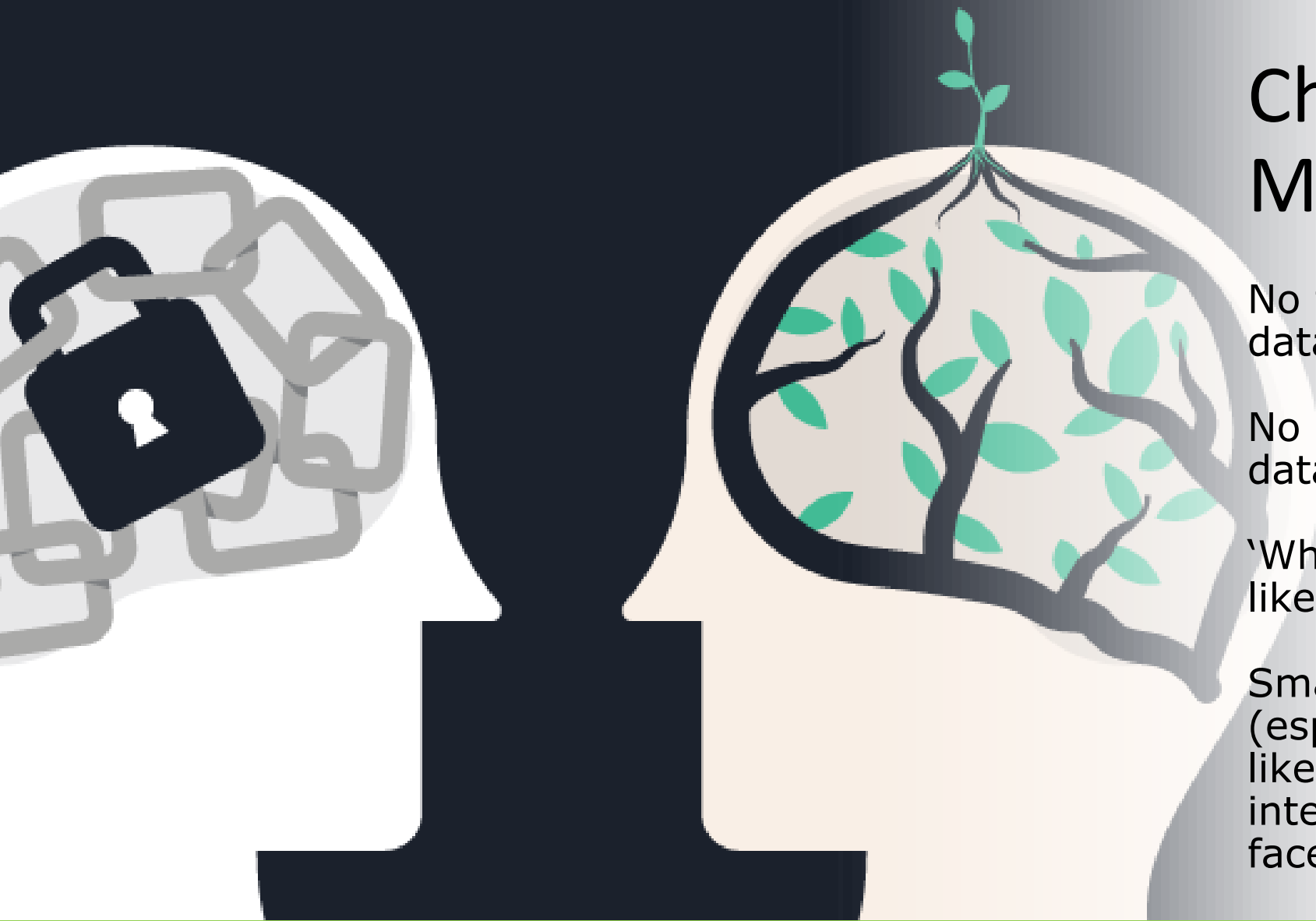


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Changing the Mindset

No faith in confidentiality of data

No confidence in how the data will be used – ‘taxes’;

‘What’s in it for me’ – seems like an empty promise

Small populations – (especially for sensitive data likelihood of being interviewed by a familiar face)



The Performance Gap

The World Bank produces the Statistical Performance Index (SPI) whose framework focuses on five key pillars of a country's statistical performance:

1. Data use - 'its of no value unless its used'
2. Data services – what services are provided?
3. Data products – what products are being produced?
4. Data sources – where can we actually find the data?
5. Data infrastructure – what infrastructure exist, even for accessibility and storage?

Data literacy is the ability to read, write, analyze, communicate, and reason with data. It's a skill that allows individuals and organizations to make better, data-driven decisions

- Lack of understanding
- Data overload – what is reliable and what is spurious
- Difficulty in communicating data
- Poor quality data
- Insufficient tools and resources
- Low confidence in data skills
- Reluctance to adopt data-driven decision making.



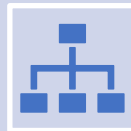

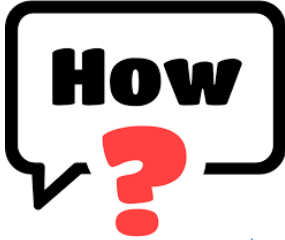

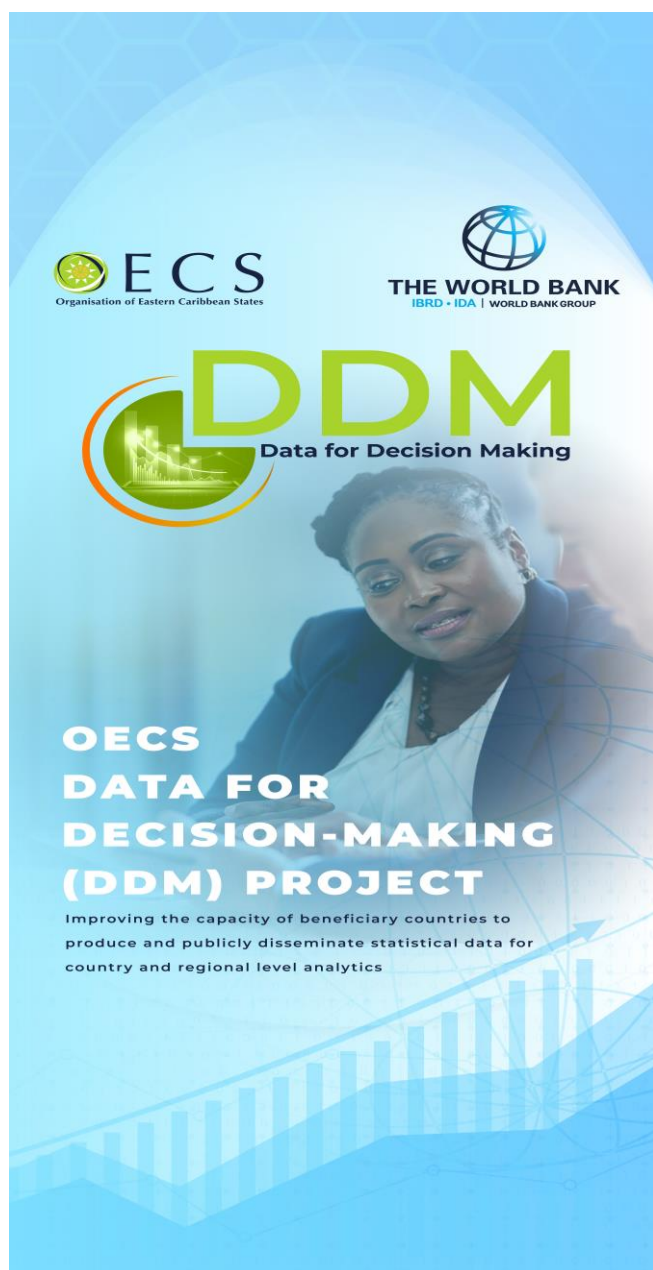
