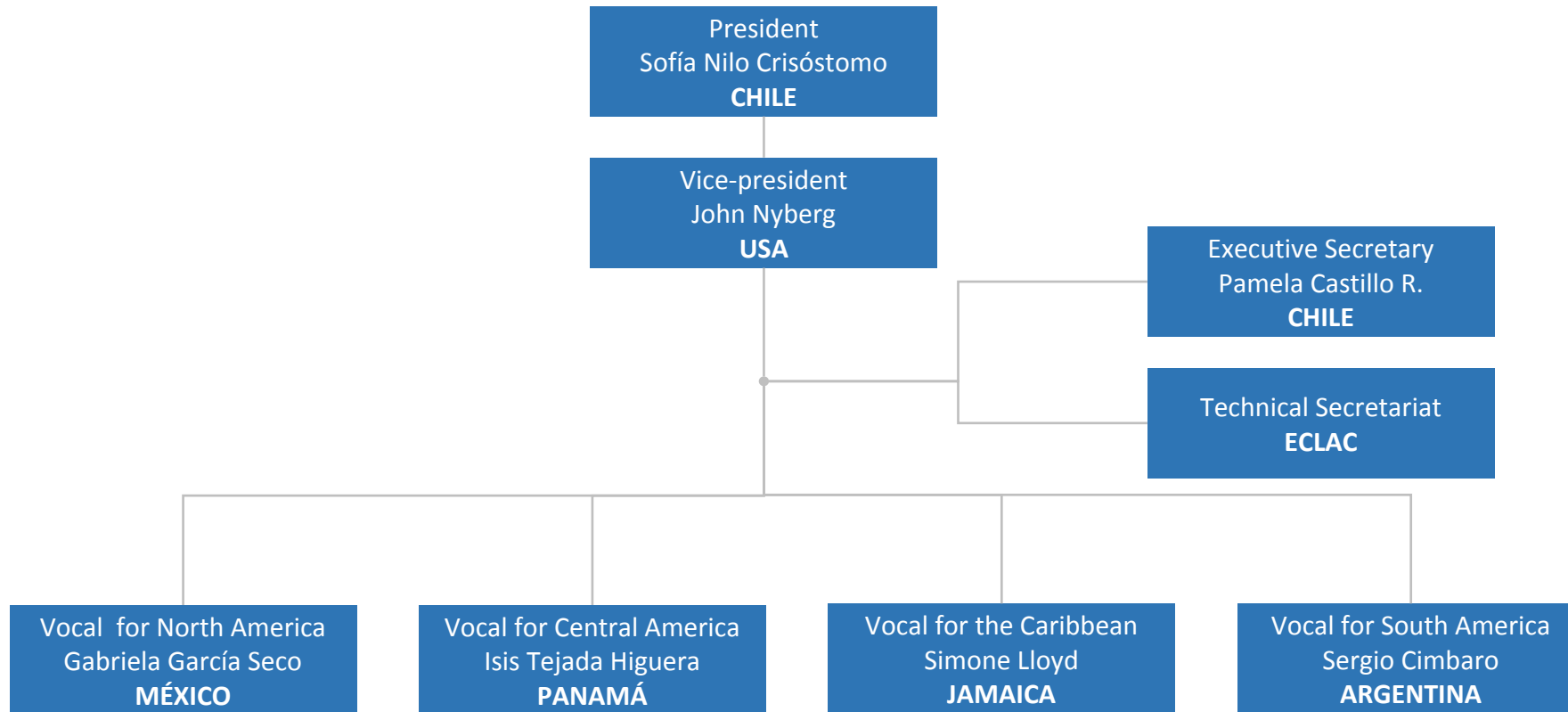

5. Support the implementation of standards at the national level

CARIGEO initiative

Objective:

To empower the countries and territories of the Caribbean region to advance in the use and exchange of geospatial, statistical and related information, supporting better decision-making for sustainable national and regional development.

Proposal:

To seek funding sources to continue strengthening new projects that allow progress in the use of geospatial information, knowledge exchanges, technology adoption, among others.

Joint Action Plan

Objective:
