




MTF 2015 – 2018: Achieving Inclusive Growth and Sustainable Development









Advancing the Process

- Finalization of the Indicator Framework for Monitoring the SDGs
- Strengthening of the Institutional Framework for Implementation and Monitoring of the SDGS
- Preparation of a paper documenting Jamaica's process for preparation of its National Outcome Document and alignment with Vision 2030 Jamaica – to be supported by WHO/PAHO and posted on WHO website
- Finalization of Draft SDGs Roadmap for Jamaica and implementation (Draft document is the result of a UNDP supported MAPS Mission, October 25-28, 2016)

A ROADMAP TOWARD \$DG IMPLEMENTATION

- Considering all planning documents, sectoral plans, out of 115 targets 105 fully or partially reflected (91.3%)
- For Vision 2030 and MTF, out of 115 targets 89 targets fully or partially reflected (77%)
- Moving from planning to action calls for the prioritization of SDG accelerators. The alignment of the Vision 2030 Jamaica national outcomes with the SDGs s provides entry points for acceleration.
- A need to continue to strengthen the data ecosystem. Gaps in environmental data was identified as an area to be addressed.

A ROADMAP TOWARD \$DG IMPLEMENTATION

- Using a mix of public-private initiatives to support the financing of the SDGs
- Call to Action of all stakeholders: Advocacy
