

## Dominican Republic

This paper focuses on an analysis of sustainability gaps in the tourism clusters of Puerto Plata and Colonial City in the Dominican Republic, based on the idea that tourism is an economic sector with great potential to contribute to the development of a territory, provided that it is based on sustainability.

### Sustainability in the tourist clusters

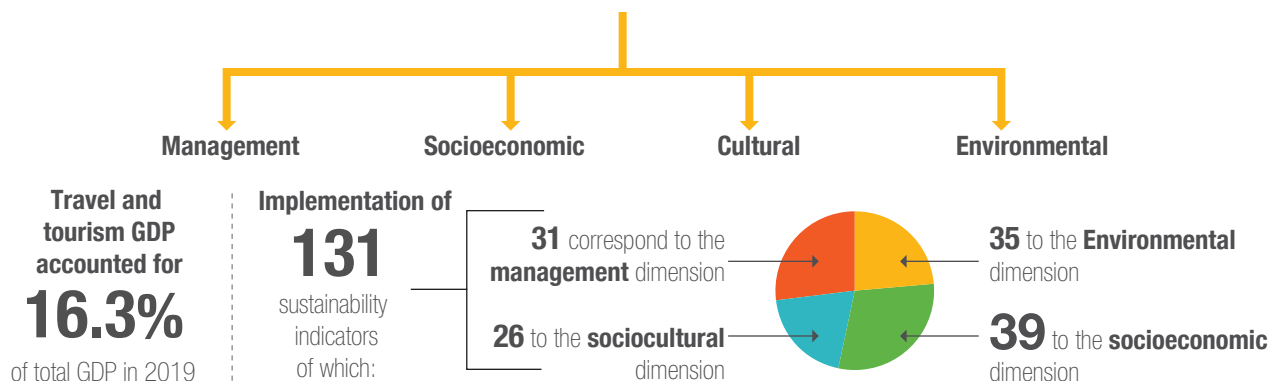
Sustainability is related to the optimal use of the environmental resources of tourist destinations, conserving natural resources, taking advantage of their cultural heritage, involving the local population in their development, education, and constant monitoring of the territory.



The Dominican Republic has more than five decades of developing a successful tourism business model that has driven it to becoming the leader in international tourist arrivals in the insular Caribbean. However, recent economic, social and biological crises such as the Covid-19 pandemic, have highlighted the vulnerability and lack of resilience of the sector and, therefore, the need to make changes aimed at its recovery.

### Identification of sustainability gaps

Adaptation of 131 sustainability indicators to identify and measure the sector's gaps and implement public policy recommendations to strengthen management structures and create disciplines for systemic monitoring of tourism impacts in four dimensions is proposed:



### Ranking of indicators by dimension

The information gathered in the study allows for identification of gaps between the four dimensions of both tourism clusters. Gap implies inequality; this represents a barrier to sustainable development of the tourism clusters.

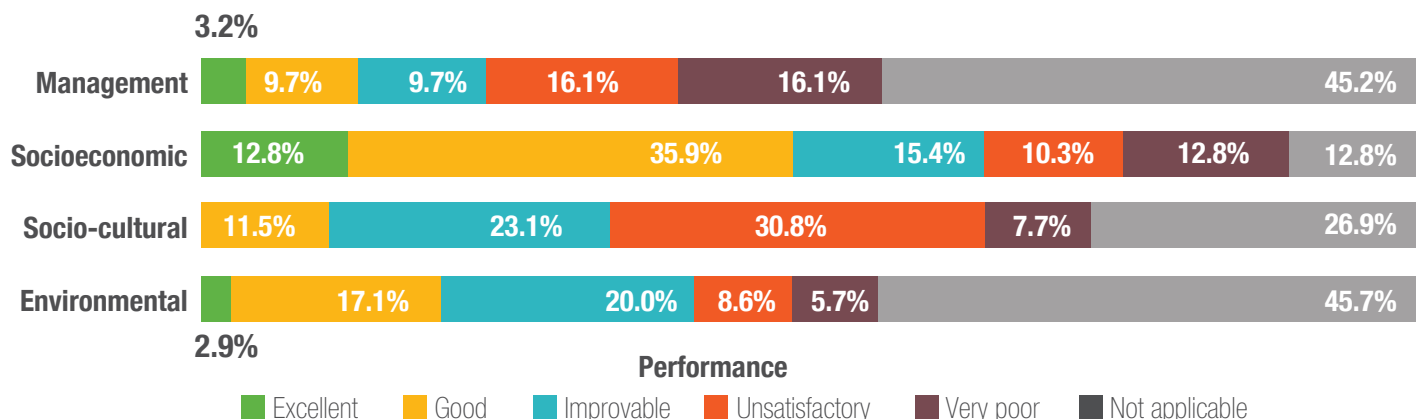

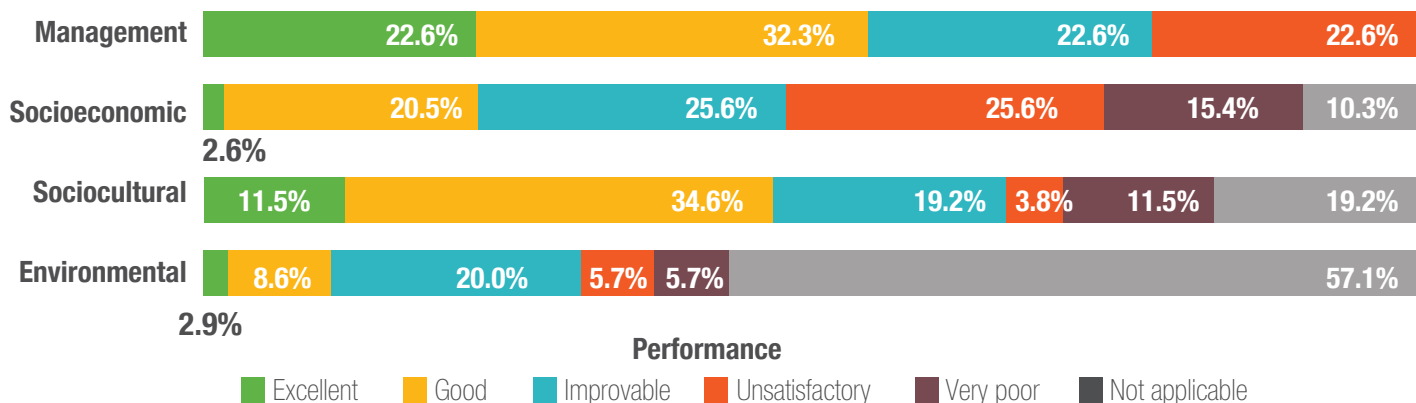
## Puerto Plata<sup>1</sup>

This exercise represents a first methodological and measurement approximation of these indicators. The implementation involved challenges related to the availability and systematization of the required information, so the lessons learned from the process are being incorporated into a second exercise that is being carried out in the remaining six tourism clusters of the Dominican Republic.

Note: In the environmental dimension, the rating "does not apply" corresponds to 20 indicators (57.1%) of the 35 that comprise it. Of these, 8 (22.9%) were discarded because they fall into the category of protected areas and Colonial City is an urban destination. It was not possible to measure the remaining 12 indicators due to lack of available information.
