


Regional knowledge management platform for the SDGs

-  A reference entry point for all information on the 2030 Agenda and the SDGs in Latin America and the Caribbean
-  It allows countries –and United Nations country teams– to obtain specialized knowledge to respond to emerging national needs related to the 2030 Agenda.
-  It facilitates the monitoring and statistical follow-up of progress towards the SDGs at the regional and country levels.
-  It fosters collaboration on sustainable development across regional and global entities of the United Nations development system.



Recommendations 2 and 4 on the reform of the United Nations development system at the regional level

1. Regional Collaborative Platform (RCP): unifies RCM and UNSDG/LAC
-  2. **Establishment of a regional knowledge management hub (SDG Gateway) – Issue-Based Coalitions.**
3. Strengthening of intergovernmental forums, particularly the **Forum for Sustainable Development of LAC** and **annual system-wide results based-report.**
-  4. **Consolidation of capacities on data and statistics.**
5. Delivery of shared administrative services and back-office support (BIG and BOS).

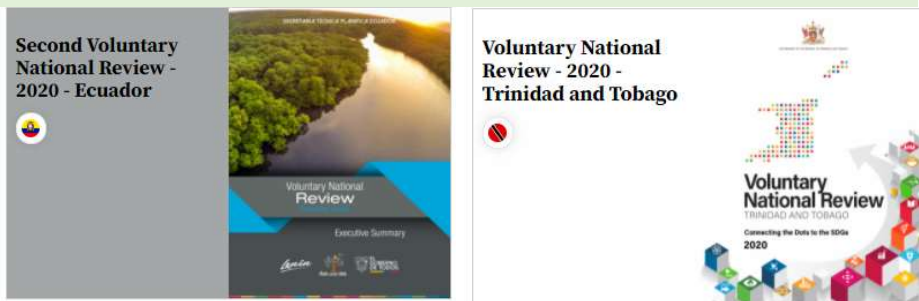


Voluntary National Reviews (VNR)

Countries of the region have intensified their efforts to strengthen the institutional framework for the implementation of the Agenda, as evidenced by the growing number of voluntary national reviews.

In Latin America and the Caribbean, 24 countries presented 35 VNRs to the HLPF in New York between 2016 and 2020. In 2021, 11 countries will submit their VNR, 4 of them for the first time. Fourteen countries have submitted their VNR more than once.

Goal 1: End poverty in all its forms everywhere

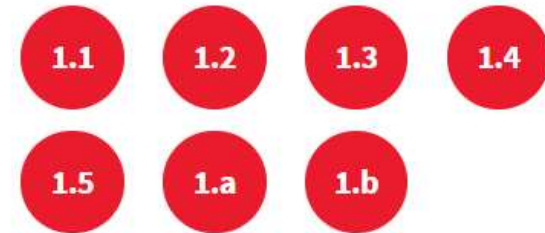
Description

Extreme poverty rates have been cut by more than half since 1990. While this is a remarkable achievement, one in five people in developing regions still live on less than US\$ 1.25 a day. Moreover, many people are at risk of slipping back into poverty.

Poverty is more than the lack of income and resources, and indicates the need to ensure a sustainable livelihood in order to access opportunities and participate fully in society.

Its manifestations include hunger and malnutrition, limited access to education and other basic services, social discrimination and exclusion as well as the lack of participation in decision-making. Economic growth must be inclusive to provide sustainable jobs, promote equality and eliminate poverty, including extreme poverty.

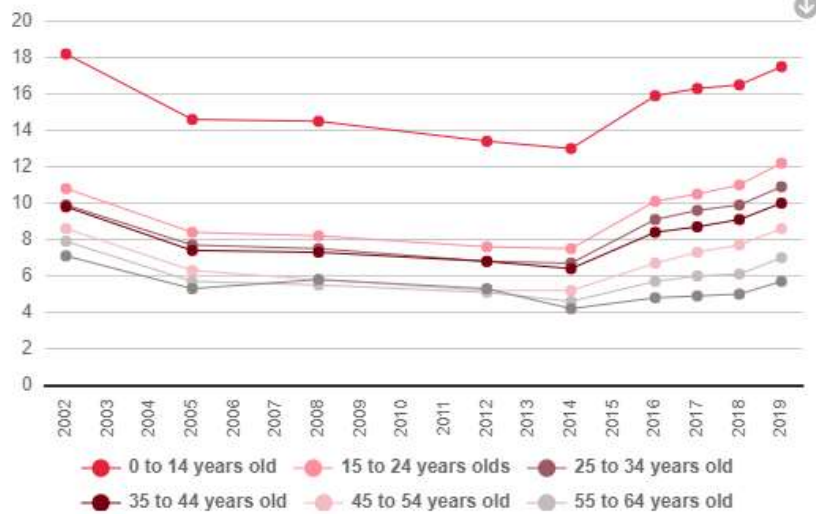

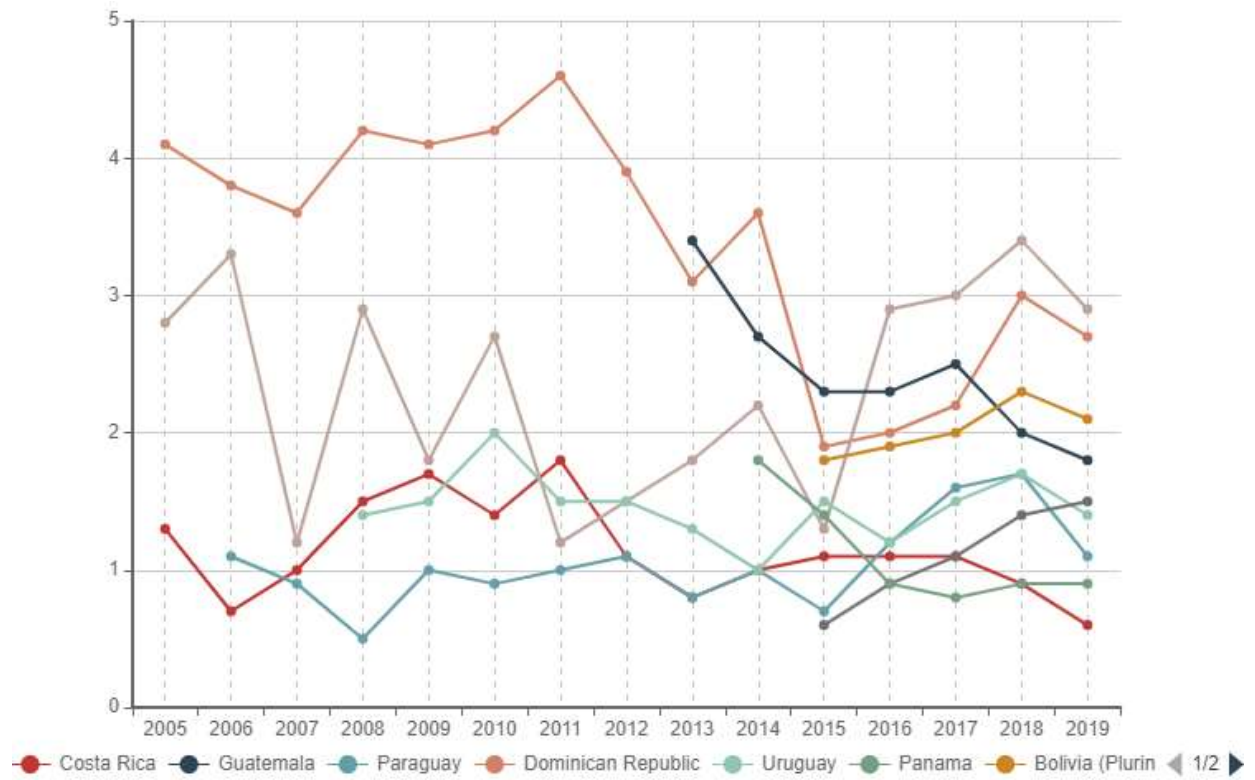

UN Women

United Nations entity dedicated to gender equality and the empowerment of women


Women and girls, everywhere, must have equal rights and opportunity, and be able to live free of violence and discrimination. Women's equality and empowerment is one of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals, but also integral to all dimensions of inclusive and sustainable development. In short, all the SDGs depend on the achievement of Goal 5.


UN Women is the United Nations entity dedicated to gender equality and the empowerment of women. It works globally to make the vision of the Sustainable Development Goals a reality for women and girls and stands behind women's equal participation in all aspects of life.

UN Women is custodian of 8 SDG indicators related to SDG 5 along with other agencies and organizations. Of these 8, UN Women is the sole custodian for two SDG 5 indicators (5.1.1 and 5.4.1). In addition, UN Women collaborates with other agencies and organizations on 9 other indicators related to SDGs 1, 4, 5, 11 and 16.

UN Women supports UN Member States as they set global standards for achieving gender equality, and works with governments and civil society to design laws, policies, programmes and services needed to ensure that the standards are effectively implemented and truly benefit women and girls worldwide. UN Women also coordinates and promotes the UN system's work in advancing gender equality, and in all deliberations and agreements linked to the 2030 Agenda. The entity works to position gender equality as fundamental to the Sustainable Development Goals, and a more inclusive world.



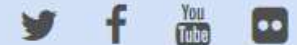

FAO

Food and Agriculture Organization

FAO works with the countries of Latin America and the Caribbean to implement the Hand in Hand Initiative, to create poverty eradication strategies for the most underdeveloped territories, also participating in the Alliance to Eliminate Rural Poverty (SG1). To eradicate hunger, FAO supports the Parliamentary Fronts Against Hunger, school feeding programs and sustainable food supply systems (SDG2).

FAO also helps to streamline gender policies and programs to improve women's food security and access to land and productive resources (SDG5). The Organization helps countries to monitor drought and improve their use of water in agriculture (SDG6). FAO is working with partners to create synergies between social protection and productive programs (SDG10). FAO strongly promotes innovation and digitalization in agriculture (SDG9) and the reduction of food waste and losses (SDG12).

The Organization also promotes climate resilient practices, low-carbon livestock and climate-smart agricultural practices for smallholder farmers, disaster risk monitoring and early warning systems (SDG13). FAO is helping countries to create programs for the mayor international funds to fight climate change, such as the Green Climate Fund, supporting countries' efforts to fight deforestation and reduce greenhouse gas emissions (SDG13). We also promote government's efforts to fight illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing (SDG14), improve their protected areas in the Amazon basin, create soil carbon maps and reduce illegal logging (SDG15).

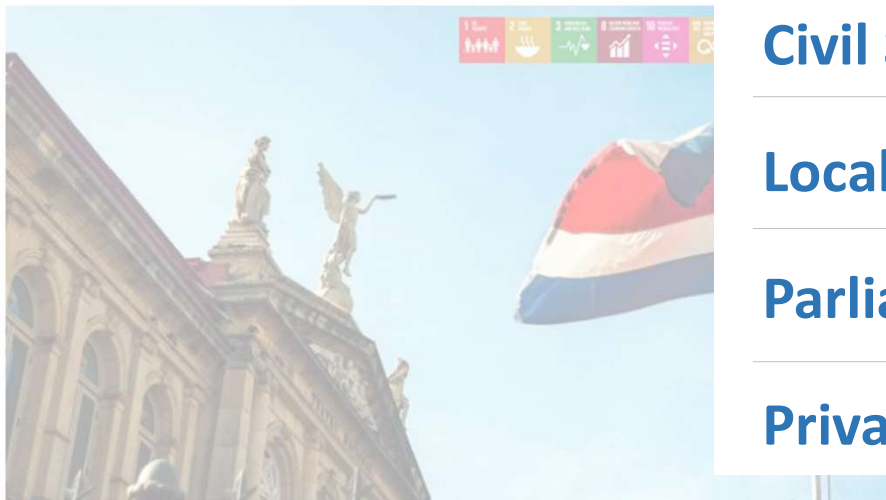

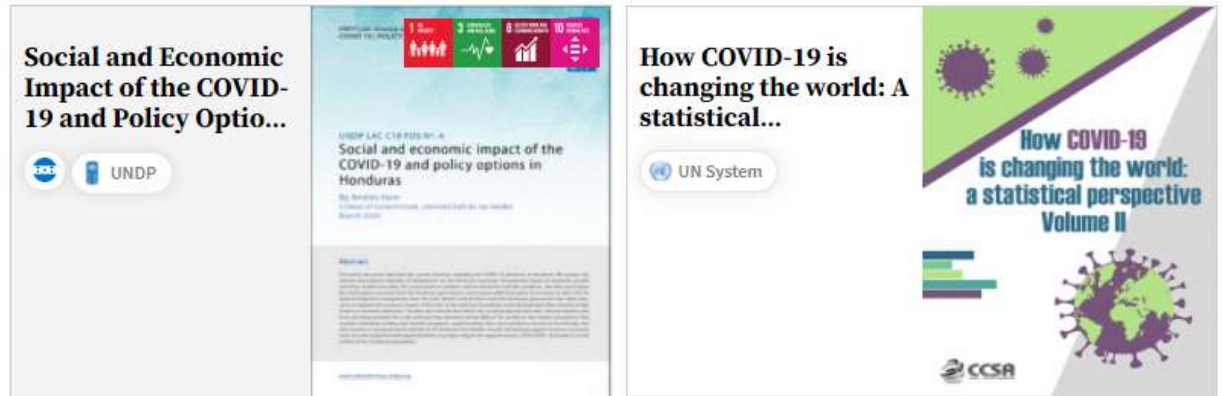
