




Impact of COVID responses on Open Government and Democracy

# Barriers

- Limited capacity to develop and implement enabling legislative frameworks
- Lack of financial and technical support for civil society organisations
- Public mistrust of procedures
- Culture of fear
- Inappropriate timescales
- Lack of political will
- Inadequate consideration of social, economic, geographical or gender characteristics of communities
- No proper response to public contributions

### **Mission oriented approach**

#### Call to action

Rebuild citizen confidence in democratic institutions

Inclusive, participatory and collaborative approaches to decision-making

Dialogue and work together in the construction of the social contracts to achieve a transformative recovery

### Conditions to promote effective engagement

- Broad, inclusive stakeholder involvement in cocreation process (CSO, vulnerable groups, directly affected, private sector etc)
- Respect for different opinions and perspectives and genuine interest in arriving at mutually agreeable decisions
- Integrity, good faith in devising and implementing cocreation mechanisms
- Proactive access to information and timely dissemination of information in understandable formats to sustain informed dialogue
- Actively listening to different positions esp. the directly affected
- Ensure an enabling and supportive regulatory infrastructure for CSOs to do their work
