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National Disaster Management Agency (NaDMA)




Background of NaDMA and it's Mandate

- National Disaster Management Agency (NaDMA)
- Established in 1985
- A Department within the Ministry of National Security, Public Administration, Home Affairs, Information & Disaster Management
- Responsible for coordinating all disaster management activities throughout Grenada, Carriacou & Petite Martinique.



National Disaster Management Plan

- ▶ Sets out the structure and operating procedures for addressing all aspects of Comprehensive Disaster Management in Grenada. The plan seeks to ensure that disaster management is executed in a coordinated and collaborative manner, ensuring that the protection of life and property is paramount.
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Damage and Needs Assessment Plan

- ▶ Provides systematic approach for conducting damage assessment and determining needs in an effective and time sensitive manner to influence response and recovery actions in Grenada
- ▶ Specifically:
 - ▶ Define all the phases of the Damage Assessment process and the strategies used to facilitate them.
 - ▶ Ensure the collection of pre-impact data
 - ▶ Ensure collection of damage data after any hazard impact to inform immediate needs.
 - ▶ Standardise procedures used for damage assessment and needs analysis inclusive estimating costs of impact and recovery
 - ▶ Facilitate the recovery phase by identifying the facilities for urgent rehabilitation and long-term reconstruction.



Other Plans

- ▶ All others plans inclusive of sector plans such as
 - Health
 - Agriculture and Fisheries
 - Roads & Transportation
 - Utilities inclusive of Telecoms
 - Ports (Air & Sea)
 - Security
 - Tourism
 - Education
 - Business continuity



CAT DDO

- ▶ The Development Policy Credit (DPC) with a Catastrophe Deferred Drawdown Option (Cat DDO) is a contingent financing line that provides immediate liquidity (US\$ 20 million) to address shocks related to natural disasters, or health-related events. It serves as an early financing instrument, while funds from other sources such as bilateral aid or reconstruction loans are being mobilized.
- ▶ The Cat DDO provides a contingent line of credit that facilitates rapid disbursement of funds for medium to high-intensity natural disasters. The Cat DDO complements the Contingency Fund by not only providing space for financial resources to accumulate by mitigating the losses of high frequency events but also supplements gaps in financing where losses exceed the available money in the Fund. It also complements the CCRIF SPC by allowing the GoG to optimize the CCRIF SPC package and premiums.
- ▶ Can only be accessed once the coordination protocol for the declaration of National and Subnational Disasters in Grenada is completed

RESPONSIBILITY ALLOCATION SCHEDULE	
Individual/Agency	Responsibility
National Disaster Management Agency (NaDMA)	Lead responsibility for management of the prevention, preparation, response, mitigation and immediate recovery phases of disasters.
Damage and Needs Analysis Committee (DANA)	Local and/or Regional committees responsible for initial damage assessment and preparation of related technical reports.
National Emergency Advisory Council (NEAC)	Advisory body responsible for the compilation of regional reports and advising NaDMA
Ministry of National Security, Public Administration, Home Affairs, Information & Disaster Management	Line ministry responsible for disaster management
Prime Minister	Convener of Cabinet and signatory of disaster declarations
Cabinet	Policy making and approval for the designation of disaster zones
