The Regional Integration Process:

 The Caribbean Community (CARICOM) and Common Market was established by the Treaty of Chaguaramas in 1973 and comprises:

15 Member States:

 Antigua and Barbuda, The Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Haiti, Jamaica, Montserrat, Saint Lucia, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Suriname, and Trinidad and Tobago.

5 Associate Members:

 Anguilla, Bermuda, British Virgin Islands, Cayman Islands and Turks and Caicos Islands.



BACKGROUND The Role of Statistics:

 The deepening of the integration process and specifically the CSME critically depends on the <u>production and dissemination of statistics</u> to guide and monitor the CSME;

Articulation of Statistics in the Revised Treaty

Article 25 – where it is stated that the CARICOM Secretariat shall:

*" collect store and disseminate to the Member States of the Community information relevant for the achievement of its objectives";

CARICOM The Standing Committee of Caribbean Statisticians - SCCS

- The <u>Standing Committee of Caribbean Statisticians</u> (SCCS), established by the Common Market Council in 1974 within the framework of the original Treaty is a major institution in statistical development;
- Terms of Reference (TORs) and Rules of Procedures exist that serve to make operational this forum.
- These TORs and Rules were reviewed to enable a more effective decision-making body.





The SCCS (cont'd):

- The SCCS comprises heads of statistical offices, international and regional organisations;
- Some activities in pursuit of its objectives include:
 - Developing and harmonising statistical concepts and methodology;
 - Coordinating and initiating programmes for statistical training/technical assistance;
 - >Recommending, approving and monitoring programmes in the field of statistics.





CARICOM ADVISORY GROUP ON STATISTICS (AGS)

The SCCS approved the establishment of the AGS at its at its 32nd Meeting in 2007 in Suriname;

* The Objectives of the AGS are to:

Establish and develop a framework to achieve the <u>implementation of the RSWP</u> in CARICOM Member countries in a manner that will result in the production of a common core of harmonised, high quality Statistics; and

Facilitate the implementation of the Resolution on strengthening the National Statistical Systems.;

* The AGS Reports to the SCCS



Common Regional Statistical Work Programme (RSWP)

- Updating of the RSWP that was approved by the Community Council of Ministers of CARICOM in 2005 was undertaken together with a diagnostic assessment;
- Work Programme was updated through two complimentary consultancies:
- the European Union, Ninth European Development Fund (9th EDF) and
- * an IDB-funded RPG project on Common Framework for Statistics Production- Component I and is to be presented to the Community Council of Ministers.



Revision of Terms of Reference (TORs) of the SCCS:

- The AGS was tasked by the SCCS with the undertaking of the revision of the Terms of Reference of the SCCS to improve its functioning as a decision-making body;
- Supported by EU funding relative to the participation of heads of statistical offices in meetings of the AGS;
- TORs have been updated and is to be presented to Council



Preparation of a Model Statistics Bill

The preparation of a Model Statistics Bill was funded under the IDB Regional Public Good Project- Common Framework for Statistics Production- Component II;

Model Bill has been prepared and has been circulated to countries for use in updating their statistics legislation;

Model Bill is supposed to contribute to the updating of statistics legislation in the region, facilitating the collection of harmonised high quality data.



Framework for Data Warehousing, Management, Archiving/Storage

This activity is in progress and is being funded under the IDB Regional Public Good Project-Common Framework for Statistics Production-Component III;

It is anticipated that it will provide manuals, guidelines and training on the establishment of Data Warehousing facilities at the national and regional levels;

Enable effective data management and the production of a data policy.

PROGRESS OF WORK CARICOM Common Framework for Literacy Surveys in CARICOM

- This activity is in progress and is being funded under the IDB Regional Public Good Project- of the same name;
- The option to be used in executing the surveys has been identified by the AGS entails a webbased approach;
- Two technical workshops of statisticians and personnel from the Ministry of Education have been convened;
- Framework to be documented by the AGS and other activities to commence, manuals etc.

PROGRESS OF WORK CARICOM Capacity-building activities funded by the EU 2011/12:

Technical Assistance Projects were completed in 2011 in a number of areas including:

- Assessment of Statistical Systems of Dominican Republic and Haiti;
- Support to the roll-out of the Online Help Desk (on www.caricomstats.org);
- Establishment of web-based communication infrastructure for data submission and Organisation of databases;
- Updating of the Common RSWP;
- Assistance with the development of NSDS frameworks,
- Merchandise Trade data processing and supporting modules;

- Code of Ethics for Statisticians in CARICOM has been developed;
- Model Bill, Updating of the RSWP, Data warehousing framework and the Common Literacy Framework - all pertinent to the production of official statistics.



CARICOM AGS

Some Issues on the Agenda of the AGS:

- Consideration of the Global High Frequency Indicators in the CARICOM Minimum Data Set for the monitoring of the CSME and also for the early detection of changes in economic trends;
- Monitoring and assessment of the implementation of the recommendations emanating from the High Level Forum on Statistics, which was convened in Trinidad and Tobago in July, 2009; and
- Perspective on Regional Coordination in the development of statistics by agencies has been developed and circulated;

Some Issues on the Agenda of the AGS:

- Monitoring of the 2011 Round –International Comparison Programme (ICP) in CARICOM ;
- Efforts at **Modernisation of Statistics** in National Statistical Offices;

- Proposed theme and activities for Caribbean Statistics Day 2012;
- Representation and Regional and International
 Meetings of countries of the CARICOM;
