Assessments by the UNSC on Implementing UN FPOS

2018 Assessment Highlights¹

- high level of awareness regarding the FPOS within National Statistical Offices/Institutes BUT not so for the whole NSS
- UNFPOS are fully integrated in the statistical law or legal framework of over 60 percent of responding countries, whereas about 27 and 6` percent of respondents reported partial and no integration, respectively.(Philippines' case)
- lack of knowledge about Principle 2 on professional standards, scientific principles and professional ethics for those working on the production of statistics among line ministries

2018 Assessment Highlights

• sample surveys, administrative data, and censuses are the most common sources of data for the production of official statistics BUT use of innovative sources of data, such as big data and citizen- generated data, is still very limited

• NSOs engage with users mostly on obtaining feedback through surveys, workshops, and web traffic analysis, NEED to keep users informed about the quality of statistical data published by National Statistical Offices

2018 Assessment Highlights

• Other weaknesses > coordination among national statistical system, and between national and international statistical agencies : implementing anonymization techniques

• level of implementation of international statistical standards is very heterogeneous across countries and regions

2018 Assessment Highlights

- most countries value international cooperation and dedicate substantial time and efforts to participate in international and regional working groups BUT need to strengthen coordination mechanisms among donors to make sure that such support is in alignment with FPOS
- with respect to open data and interoperability, it is worth reiterating that a large majority of countries still provides data downloads in proprietary formats for data analysis software, while the dissemination in open, machine-readable formats or through online APIs is not as common

Moving forward

- it is clear what needs to be done to implement UN FPOS but do we need new principles or just provide supplementary documents and guidelines
- Partnerships need to continue
- UN SC, UN Regional Commissions(ECLAC), Professional Societies(IAOS) to continue support to NSOs and NSSs
