Background of German Engagement

Germany presenting VNR at HLPF 2016.

Two German ministries in "co-charge" for VNR review at HLPF.

German government wants to support the VNR process - in a holistic manner and as a global project.





Partners for Review Program gets born.

Announced by German Government at HLPF 2016 – implementation of program kicked off by GIZ in November 2016.

Which core services shall "Partners for Review" provide?

- Formation of a network with regular network meetings twice a year.
- 2. Digital support via a virtual exchange platform.
- 3. Production of "best practice materials" to be shared within the network.





Core elements for the P4R program:

- Cross-sectoral

 approach not
 specified on particular
 SDG goals or targets
- 2. Involvement of all stakeholder groups (Gov., CSOs, Private sector, academia)
- 3. Cross-regional (global) to foster transnational and crossregional exchange




Focus (2): How to arrange and manage stakeholder involvement and participation






