Characteristics of the 1st round of peer reviews 2006-2008

- Use of 3 experts internal to the ESS (MS and Eurostat)
- Peer review approach
- Benchmark: ESCoP (2005 version)
- Review of principles 1-6 and 15 (institutional elements)
- Based on self-assessment questionnaire
- Report along the principles – common between experts and NSIs
- Improvement actions developed together by experts and NSIs
- Report and IA published on Eurostat and NSI websites



Characteristics of the 2nd round of peer reviews 2013-2015

- Use of 3 experts mostly external to the ESS
- Audit-like approach
- Benchmark: ESCoP (2011 version)
- Review of all principles
- Based on self-assessment questionnaires NSI, ONAs, coordination and integration
- Report along issues – ownership by experts, includes NSI diverging views
- Improvement actions developed by NSIs
- Report and IA published on Eurostat and NSI websites



Characteristics of the 3rd round of peer reviews 2021-2023

- Use of 4 experts – mix of internal/ external to the ESS
- Combination peer review / audit-like approach
- Benchmark: ESCoP (2017 version) and ESS QAF
- Review of all principles
- Based on self-assessment questionnaires NSI, ONAs
- Report along issues – ownership by experts, includes NSI diverging views
- Improvement actions developed by NSIs
- Report and IA published on Eurostat and NSI websites



Lessons learnt and tips

- Need for a benchmark – against what to assess (general = CoP versus specific QAF)
- Well described methodology, detailed guides for experts and NSIs
- Common development of the methodology – ownership by ESS
- Need for governance structures: Estat TFPRQ→ESS TF PR→ESSC, national coordinators
- Standardization via documents, guides, templates, additional checks + Harmonization
- Reports and recommendations
- Improvement actions and follow-up
