#### Background

- GOB responsible for the provision of potable water
- Provision of water
  - Towns and cities BWSL
  - Rural areas Rural Development Department
- 117 RWS serving132 villages
- 16 RWS are joint water systems
- 29 villages BWSL
- 12 RWS are managed by females.

#### Appointment of WBs

- The RWS are managed by Water Boards.
- Boards are appointed by the Minister
- Village Councils Act, Chapter 88 of the Laws of Belize, Revised Edition 2003.
- The Board is comprised of seven members

#### Composition of a Water Board

- The Chairperson of the Village Council
- A member of the Village Council nominated by the Village Council
- Five other members appointed by the Minister
- The minister also appoints the:
  - Chairperson
  - Deputy Chairperson
  - Secretary and
  - Treasurer
  - Member

#### Compliance with the Law

- In accordance with the Village Council and Water Board Accounting Regulations S.I #190 of 2004
  - Proper record keeping
  - Monthly Financial Reports
  - Submit to Ministry for Inspection
  - Application of Revenue

#### Responsibilities of a WB

- All operations and maintenance activities of the water system
- Regulating pumping hours to ensure uninterrupted and continuous water services.
- Keeping proper records and accounts.
- Undertaking expansions of water supply as occasion demands. (through, across, over or under any land, private or public)



#### Cont'd

- Carrying out disconnection procedures.
- Collection users fees.
- Effectively and efficiently undertaking any other function to the supply of water.
- Enter or authorise any of its employees to enter upon any land, private or public given that the owner/occupier is notified.
- Improve /Upgrade Work professionally -Have an office!
- Submit financial report <u>MONTHLY</u> to the Ministry.
